



RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

Junior Fellowships (two places)

Available to students who have obtained a BA in ancient history, archaeology or classical languages. It is expected that these fellowships will be held while the candidate is enrolled (or planning enrolment) for a higher degree.

Students who obtain the fellowships will be asked to undertake a numismatic research project (the results of which will be presented in a seminar), and to assist in the work of ACANS. At the end students will submit a brief report on their activities to the director.

Fellowship value: approx. A\$5,000.

Tenure: the fellowship will be held on a part-time basis during the first semester 2008 (roughly between February and May).

Interstate and New Zealand applicants. Provision has now been made for applicants from interstate or from New Zealand who wish to apply for the Junior Fellowship. The applicant may either take up the stipend or request a return airfare and accommodation (with all meals provided) to be arranged by ACANS at a college on campus during the period of tenure. It is expected that the applicant will be at the Centre on a full-time basis, and that the period of tenure will be shorter (around 11 weeks).

There is no set application form. Applicants should write or email the director of ACANS enclosing a CV and outlining those research interests which the candidate is currently pursuing or planning to develop.
